There appeared to be no further inflammation. Fernanda was still sick, but at least not getting any worse

Iris and her kids then made that huge step that we all pray for...they went from participating in the ESL and basketball classes to actually attending a Tuesday night Bible study. Shortly after, Rod met her on the street, close to the church. She had difficulty expressing exactly what she wanted to say, but said that she couldn't believe that people like us actually existed, that she felt so loved, so accepted by us and with us. And no
